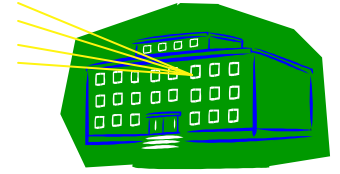

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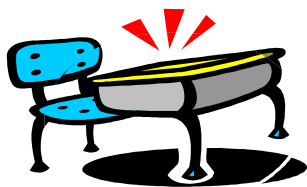

## Attendance Policy

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### High School Hours:

7:00 AM—2:00PM

### Parking:

Students planning to park in the High School parking lot will need to obtain a parking pass. Parking passes cost \$30. The numbered passes can be purchased at the same time fees are paid.

### Absences:

State law requires that parents notify the school of an absence. Absences without parental notification are unexcused.

To report an absence please call the school attendance line 619-2424 by **6:50 AM**. **Please follow up with a note regarding the absence when the student returns to school. Remember, absences of more than 8 days a year are considered excessive.**

### Tardies:

Students not in class by **7:00 AM** are required to sign in at the attendance window before reporting to class.

Parents should notify the school if the student is late due to an appointment.

### Dismissal:

A call or note from the parent is necessary to submit to the office or teacher for a student to be released at a time other than the scheduled dismissal time.

All notes are verified with a call to the parent(s).

Please communicate any last minute dismissal changes by 1:00 pm.

## Student Fees

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Each student is required to pay student fees. Fees are assessed in order to help cover the cost of consumable materials that are required and used in various courses.

To obtain an application for waiver of student instructional fees see the school office. AFDC or DA verification is necessary for eligibility. Applications will not be approved without this documentation.

**Fees not paid accumulate from year to year.**

## School Supplies

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A complete list of school supplies for your student's grade level will be communicated on the first day of class from each teacher.

## Medication Policy

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For your student's safety, no student is permitted to have any type of medication on them. The only exception to this is with certain emergency medications by written order of the doctor and prior approval of the district nurse. School employees cannot dispense any medication unless they have the proper forms signed by the parent/guardian. The doctor must also sign for prescription medications. All medications and forms must be brought to the school office by a parent/guardian.



## Graduation Requirements

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22 Total Credits are required for graduation from Winton Woods High School.

Credits must be obtained in the following manner:

- 4 credits of English
- 3 credits of Mathematics
- 3 credits of Science
- 3 credits of Social Studies
  - 1 credit Amer. History
  - 1/2 credit Govt.
  - 1/2 credit Economics
- 1/2 credit of Physical Ed
- 1/2 credit of Health
- 2 credits of a fine art or foreign Lang.

- Each student must pass the OGT
- All verified credits earned in other educational institutions or programs must be turned in by date specified by the principal

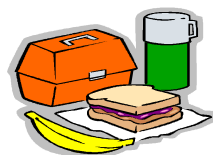
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## Visitor Policy



All visitors must sign in at the building office upon entering the building. A Visitor's Pass will be issued to you by the office staff. Please remember to sign out at the office when you are ready to leave the building.

## Lunch Policy



All schools in the district have a computerized cash register system. Students enter their student identification number on a keypad, which generates their photo and account on the screen.

Prepayment is accepted and can eliminate the hassle of lost or forgotten money. This allows students eligible for paid, free, or reduced priced meals to pass through the lunch line quickly.

To prepay in cash, it must be in a sealed envelope marked with the student's full name, school, and grade. Checks can be made payable to **Winton Woods Food Service**. *Please specify if money is for lunch, ala carte items, or both.*

Cash payment for lunch or extra items in the lunch line is always an option .

This service is available 24 hours a day 7 days a week, free of charge.

Free/Reduced lunch applications must be submitted each school year. One application per family. They are available at the time of enrollment and at the school offices.

Please allow for up to 2 weeks for processing once the F/R lunch application is submitted.

## WWCS K-12 Dress Code

### Expectations:

The Board of Education believes that a neat and orderly appearance is a positive factor for school safety and success. In keeping with that belief, the dress code shall be adhered to by all students enrolled in Winton Woods City Schools.

### Exceptions:

Exceptions will be considered for special events, cultural beliefs, and to promote school spirit. Students and/or sponsors must have permission from the principal prior to the activity.

### Consequences for Non-Compliance:

Students who, according to the administrator or staff members, are dressed inappropriately for school will be dismissed from class until a change of clothing is secured.

First Offense—The student will be excluded from the classroom. Parent/Guardian will be contacted to bring appropriate clothing. If the student does not have an appropriate uniform to change in to, he/she will not return to the classroom (e.g., in-school suspension room, office, etc.).

Second Offense—The student is placed on 24 hour emergency removal from school.
